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#### 1.0 INDIA

India, (Republic of India) is a country in South Asia. It is the seventh-largest country by area and the second-most populous country. Bounded by the Indian Ocean on the south, the Arabian Sea on the southwest, and the Bay of Bengal on the southeast, it shares land borders with Pakistan to the west; China, Nepal, and Bhutan to the north; and Bangladesh and Myanmar to the east. In the Indian Ocean, India is in the vicinity of Sri Lanka and the Maldives; its Andaman and Nicobar Islands share a maritime border with Thailand, Myanmar, and Indonesia.

India, the world's fifth-largest economy, saw a robust performance in 2022 with a GDP growth of 7.2% and 7.8% in 2023 (World Bank), also, growth in India is projected to remain strong at 6.8 percent in 2024 and 6.5 percent in 2025, with the robustness reflecting continuing strength in domestic demand and a rising working-age population.

The start of FY 2023-24 showed rapid growth driven by public investment and private consumption, but the global economic slowdown has negatively impacted merchandise trade. Despite stable current growth indicators, there are significant challenges posed by global uncertainties and the lingering effects of domestic policy tightening. Additionally, some socio-economic indicators, such as consumer goods sales in rural areas, are underperforming.

The IMF forecasts a budget deficit of 8.5% for 2024, reducing to 8% by 2025. The debt-to-GDP ratio slightly increased to 81.9% in 2023 and is projected to rise to 82.2% by 2025 (IMF). The IMF estimates an inflation rate of 5.5% for the year, with a decrease expected over the forecast period (4.6% this year and 4.1% in 2025).

# India's Trade Flows and Position in the Global Trade

 In FY2023/2024, India's exports to Africa were valued at USD 45.4 billion which accounted for 10.4% of the total india's exports to the world during the year.

- On the other hand, India's imports in the year were valued at USD 38.0 billion which accounted for 5.6% of the total india's imports from the world.
- Her lead export destination market in Africa (2023/2024) was South Africa with exports valued at USD 8.7 billion, accounting for 19.2% of India's total exports.
- In the same year, India's top source market from Africa was South Africa with imports valued at USD 10.5 million accounting for 27.7% of India's imports.
- Her main principal export product to Africa was Petroleum oil (Ex-crude)
   with her exports being valued at USD 15.2 billion.
- India's chief import product from Africa in 2023/2024 was Gold. The country imported approximately **USD 8.5 billion** worth of the product in the year under review.

India's import landscape with Africa has experienced significant shifts, with a notable 18.5% decline in total import value from USD 46,650.4 million in 2022-2023 to USD 38,021.7 million in 2023-2024.

Despite this overall decrease, South Africa remains the leading exporter, showing a slight growth of 1.4% to USD 10,543.3 million, while other major exporters like Nigeria and Angola saw declines.

Kenya was ranked 28<sup>th</sup> exporter from Africa with positive growth of 51.1% between 2022/2023 to 2023/2024.

Gold is the leading commodity with an export value of USD 8,518.8 million, showing a 7.3% increase and accounting for 22.4% of the total imports.

Despite being a major export commodity from Africa, crude petroleum oils saw a significant drop of 45.3% to USD 8,081.3 million, representing 21.3% of the total share.

Coal also decreased by 10.8% to USD 4,715.5 million, holding a 12.4% share.

Overall, the total value of African exports to India fell by 18.5%, from USD 46,650.4 million to USD 38,021.7 million.

Overall, the total exports from India to Africa decreased by 11.4%, from USD 51,199.3 million to USD 45,375.2 million, indicating mixed performance across different countries.

South Africa is the leading export destination, with exports increasing by 2.8% to USD 8,707.5 million, making up 19.2% of the total exports. Tanzania follows, experiencing a 17.3% growth to USD 4,616.6 million (10.2%). Nigeria saw a substantial decline of 29.0% to USD 3,663.5 million, representing 8.1% of the total. Other notable changes include a 46.6% decrease in exports to Togo and a 3.0% decline to Kenya.


Petroleum oils excluding crude remained the top export commodity despite a 20.3% decline, accounting for 33.5% of total exports at USD 15,194.5 million. Rice followed with USD 3,608.4 million (8.0%), experiencing a 12.3% drop. Medicaments saw a 9.0% increase, reaching USD 3,289.5 million (7.2%). Significant decreases were noted in motor cars (down 21.5%) and cane/beet sugar (down 27.4%) among others.

- Kenya's exports to India were valued at an average value of Ksh. 8.42 billion, with an annual average growth rate of 21.4% between 2019 and 2023 and 30.6% between 2022 and 2023.
- Kenya's imports from India were also valued at an average value of Ksh. 217.4 billion, with an annual average growth rate of 11.4% between 2019 and 2023 and 22.6% between 2022 and 2023.
- The balance of trade between the two countries has widened in favour of India between 2019 and 2023 by an average value of Ksh. 209.2 billion and a total trade deficit of Ksh. 258.6 billion in 2023.

NB: The Agency has not received data from KRA for the 1st Quarter of 2024.




