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KENYA'S TRADE PERFORMANCE IN JAN-MARCH (2023 AND 2024)

1.0 Overview

In the first quarter of 2024, Kenya's trade dynamics revealed significant trends and shifts compared to the same period in 2023. Total exports surged to Kshs 253.9 billion, marking a notable 19.5% increase totalling to Kshs 41.5 billion from Kshs 212.4 billion in the previous year. This growth contrasts with a substantial 15.8% rise in imports, which increased to Kshs 676.0 billion from Kshs 586.3 billion in 2023 (an increase of 15.8%). As a result, the trade deficit in merchandise trade widened by 13.7%, reaching Kshs 425.2 billion in 2024, up from Kshs 373.9 billion the year before.

This period also witnessed significant changes in Kenya's export markets and commodity performance. While countries like Pakistan, the UK, and the Netherlands registered an increase in Kenyan exports, there were notable declines in imports from China and Iran. The composition of Kenya's export products shifted, with substantial growth in tea and horticulture exports, contrasting with a decline in metalliferous ores and metal scrap.

Kenya's trade balance with various countries showed diverse outcomes, including improvements with the UAE and Saudi Arabia, but deteriorations with the USA and China.

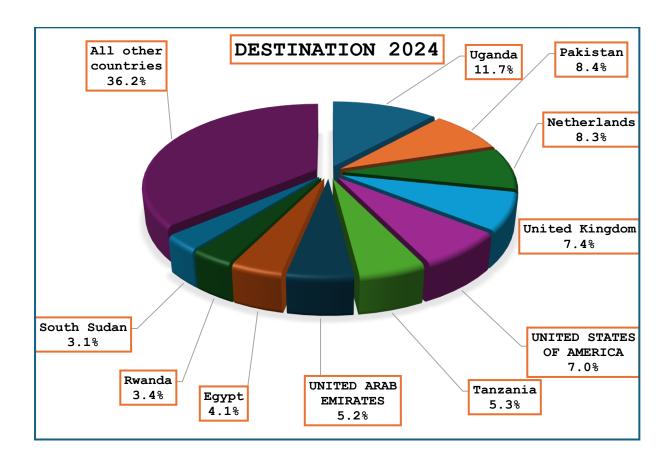

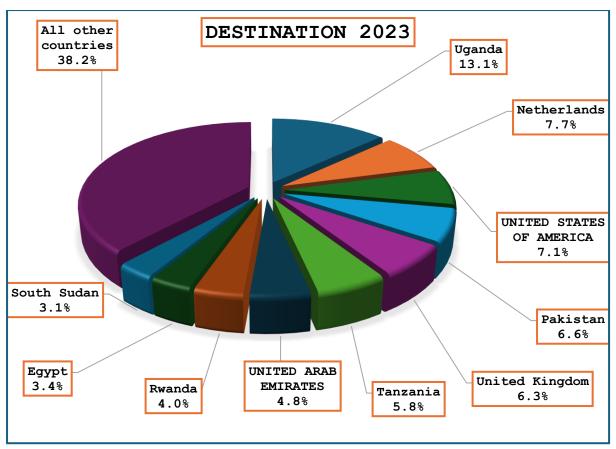

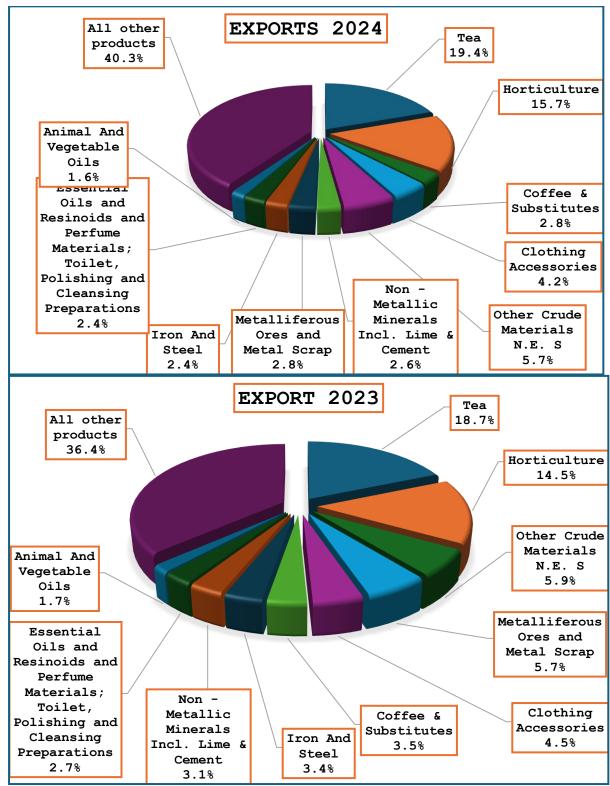

Figure 2: Share of Top Exports by Products, Jan-March (2023-2024)





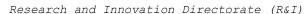

- Kenya's trade with other partners recorded a trade deficit of Kshs 425.2 billion in 2024 and Kshs 373.9 billion in 2023. Leading to widened trade deficit by Kshs 51.3 billion in the reviewed period Jan to March.
- Based on the trade data from January to March 2023 and 2024, Kenya experienced significant shifts in its trade balances with various countries. In the top 25 category, Kenya improved its trade balance with the United Arab Emirates (UAE) by Ksh 18.6 billion, reducing the deficit from Ksh 72.4 billion in 2023 to Ksh 53.8 billion in 2024. Similarly, trade with China improved by Ksh 37.1 billion, reducing the deficit from Ksh 83.1 billion to Ksh 120.1 billion.
- The trade balance with the United States of America (USA) worsened by Ksh 19.9 billion, changing from a deficit of Ksh 3.4 billion in 2023 to Ksh 23.3 billion in 2024. Saudi Arabia saw a significant improvement of Ksh 40.2 billion, reducing its deficit from Ksh 40.4 billion to Ksh 0.2 billion. Germany's trade balance improved by Ksh 0.8 billion, while France improved by Ksh 2.1 billion. However, India saw its trade balance worsen by Ksh 5.4 billion, and Belgium's deficit increased by Ksh 11.3 billion.





- The trade deficit with several countries widened by more than Ksh 3 billion. The trade balance with the Netherlands worsened by Ksh 7.0 billion, and the USA saw a significant decline of Ksh 19.9 billion. Trade with China deteriorated by Ksh 37.1 billion, while Saudi Arabia improved by Ksh 40.2 billion. India's trade balance worsened by Ksh 5.4 billion, and Belgium's deficit increased by Ksh 11.3 billion.
- Kenya also managed to overturn a trade deficit to a surplus with Zambia, shifting from a negative trade balance of Ksh 0.4 billion in 2023 to a positive balance of Ksh 2.8 billion in 2024, marking an improvement of Ksh 3.2 billion.
- Overall, the total trade balance with African countries improved by Ksh 2.7 billion, from Ksh 27.5 billion in 2023 to Ksh 30.2 billion in 2024. However, the overall trade deficit for Kenya increased by Ksh 51.3 billion, worsening from Ksh 373.9 billion in 2023 to Ksh 425.2 billion in 2024.

6.0 Deduction from the Quarter performance January to March 2024.

In the period from January to March 2024, Kenya's total exports increased by 19.5%, reaching Ksh 253.9 billion from Ksh 212.4 billion in 2023. Imports also rose by 15.8%, totalling Ksh 676.0 billion compared to Ksh 586.3 billion in the same period in 2023. This led to a widened trade deficit of Ksh 425.2 billion in 2024, an increase of Ksh 51.3 billion from the previous year's deficit of Ksh 373.9 billion.

Key export markets showed notable growth, with Pakistan, the UK, and the Netherlands registering significant increases in imports from Kenya. Conversely, exports to China and Iran declined. Major products such as tea, horticulture, and cereals saw substantial growth, whereas metalliferous ores and metal scrap experienced a notable decline.

Kenya's trade balance improved significantly with countries like the UAE, China, and Saudi Arabia. However, the trade deficit worsened with the USA, India, and Belgium. A notable achievement was turning a trade deficit with Zambia into a surplus, marking an improvement of Ksh 3.2 billion.

Overall, while Kenya's export performance has improved and trade balances with several countries have become more favourable, the overall trade deficit has increased, highlighting ongoing challenges in balancing imports and exports.
