1.0 SOUTH AFRICA

1.1 Background

South Africa stands as one of Africa's most advanced economies, sharing the top spot with Nigeria. The country hosts about 75% of the largest companies on the continent, underpinned by a well-developed economic infrastructure. The national government has implemented policy measures aimed at restoring macroeconomic stability, prioritizing economic growth, reducing unemployment, and maintaining favourable credit ratings. Despite these efforts, South Africa grapples with significant challenges such as escalating public debt, inefficiencies in state-owned enterprises, and fiscal pressures, which have weakened its global competitiveness. After recording a 1.9% GDP growth in 2022, the economy expanded by 0.4% and 0.6% during the first two quarters of 2023, primarily driven by investments in machinery, and equipment. However, infrastructure, consumption declined for the first time since 2021 in the second guarter of 2023. For the full year, the IMF estimated GDP growth at 0.9%, hindered by an ongoing energy crisis attributed to mismanagement at Eskom, the stateowned power utility. This crisis severely impacted electricity-reliant industries, including mining, metals, paper, and retail. Despite interventions, President Cyril Ramaphosa declared a "state of national disaster" in February 2023. The IMF projects GDP growth of 1.8% in 2024 and 1.6% in 2025, with investment serving as the primary growth driver, while private consumption is expected to remain subdued.

Although South Africa has been surpassed by Nigeria as Sub-Saharan Africa's largest economy, it continues to exert significant regional influence. Fiscal challenges persisted in the first half of 2023, marked by a decline in tax revenue and public sector wage settlements exceeding planned budgets. This led to a substantial fiscal deficit of -6.2% of GDP, reversing progress from two years of fiscal consolidation. Projections suggest that fiscal stabilization will occur in 2024 and 2025, with the adoption of contractionary fiscal policies. The public debt-to-GDP ratio climbed to 73.7% in 2023, up from 71.1% in the previous year, and is expected to reach 78.8% by 2025. Including non-financial and financial public corporations, the total gross consolidated public debt approximates 120% of GDP. Additional support for struggling state-owned enterprises risks exacerbating this debt burden. Inflation remained elevated at an average rate of 6% in 2023, peaking above this level from January to May before moderating in the second half of the year. The IMF forecasts inflation to decline to around 4.5% in the medium term.

Unemployment remains a pressing issue, although there has been improvement. By the third quarter of 2023, the official unemployment rate



fell below 32% for the first time since late 2020 (Statistics SA). However, unemployment remains disproportionately high among young people and the black majority, exacerbating inequality in a nation recognized as one of the most unequal globally. According to the World Bank, 55.5% of South Africans live below the national upper poverty line. The IMF reported South Africa's average GDP per capita (PPP) at USD 16,211 in 2023.

South Africa's Trade Flows and Position in the Global Trade

- In 2023, South Africa's exports were valued at **USD 110.7 Billion** which accounted for **0.5%** of the world exports during the year. South Africa was the **38**th exporter in the year.
- On the other hand, in 2023, South Africa's imports were valued at USD **107.3 Billion** which accounted for **0.5%** of the world imports during the year. South Africa was the **40**th importer in the year.
- Her lead export destination market in 2023 was China with exports valued at USD 12.5 Billion, accounting for 11.3% of South Africa's total exports.
- In the same year South Africa's top source market was China with imports valued at **USD 21.9 Billion** accounting for **20.5%** of South Africa's imports.
- South Africa's chief import product in 2023 was Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals excl. crude USD 15.2 Billion worth of the product.

- ➤ South Africa's total imports were valued at USD 107.3 Billion in 2023. Imports had average growth of 7.4% per year. Between 2022 and 2023, imports declined by 4.1% from USD 111.9 Billion in 2022 to USD 107.3 billion in 2023.
- ➤ The major South Africa's import source in 2023 were China (USD 21.9 Billion; 20.5%), USA (USD 9.2 Billion; 8.6%), Germany (USD 8.7 Billion; 8.1%), India (USD 7.5 Billion; 7.0%), and UAE (USD 4.0 Billion; 3.7%).
- ➤ Save for Nigeria and Namibia, no other African countries appeared in South African's top 25 import source.

- South Africa's lead export markets in 2023 included: China (USD 12.5 Billion; 11.3%), USA (USD 8.4 Billion; 7.6%), Germany (USD 7.8 Billion; 7.1%), Mozambique (USD 6.2 Billion; 5.6%), and Area Nes (USD 6.1 Billion; 5.5%)


➤ The major products that South Africa's exported in 2023 included: Platinum, incl. palladium (9.7%), Coat briquettes, Ovoids and similar (7.1%), Iron ores and concentrates (5.9%), Motor vehicles for transports of goods (5.4%), and Gold (5.1%).



3.0 BILATERAL TRADE BETWEEN KENYA AND SOUTH AFRICA

3.1 Trade Balance

- > The balance of trade has been in favour of South Africa between 2014 and 2023.
- ➤ Kenya's export to South Africa's decreased from USD 67.5 million in 2014 to USD 53.5 million in 2023.
- ➤ On the other hand, Kenya's import from South Africa fluctuated through the past decade highest being USD 726.5 million in 2014 and lowest USD 402.4 million in 2022.
- ➤ The balance of trade between the two countries has widened in favour of South Africa between 2014 and 2023 by an average value of USD 523.8 million.




4.0 SHARE ON KENYA EXPORTS AND IMPORTS TRADE WITH SOUTH AFRICA


